# INTRODUCTION

KMTC has 71 established Campuses strategically located in 43 Counties in the Country. Through an ambitious and rapid expansion programme to meet the growing demand for skilled health Personnel, KMTC established 43 Campuses within eight (8) years, that is, between 2013 and 2021. The other 28 had been established between 1927 and 2012.

Further, the College has Campuses under construction in Marsabit and Narok which upon completion will bring the total number to 73 Campuses across 45 of the 47 Counties.

The leadership of the relevant County Governments, the area Members of Parliament, and local communities contributed immensely to the rapid expansion and development of these new Campuses. They provided land and construction of the supportive infrastructure.

Additionally, KMTC established five (6) Annex Campuses during the rapid expansion period: Teso - Busia, Mbuvo - Makueni, Masita - Bondo (2012), Ndhiwa - Homa Bay (2020), Shianda - Kakamega (2020), and Ugunja - Siaya (2021)

It is in only two (2) Counties - Samburu and Kirinyaga that KMTC is yet to establish a Campus.

## Inception and Growth

The Campus started at Jeans School Kabete (Former Kenya Institute of Administration and currently, Kenya School of Government and later relocated to King George the VI Hospital (KNH). It started as a Training Unit on the Job during the Colonial period and later relocated to KNH due to expansion and demand for skilled manpower used to operate as the central point for the other Medical Training Centres until 2001 when it was delinked and given a self-governing status with Student population growing to the current 5,000. Today, KMTC Nairobi has developed into a complex institution with a wide spectrum of Departments and Programs that have expanded and diversified to offer training ranging from Certificate, Diploma, and Higher Diplomas.

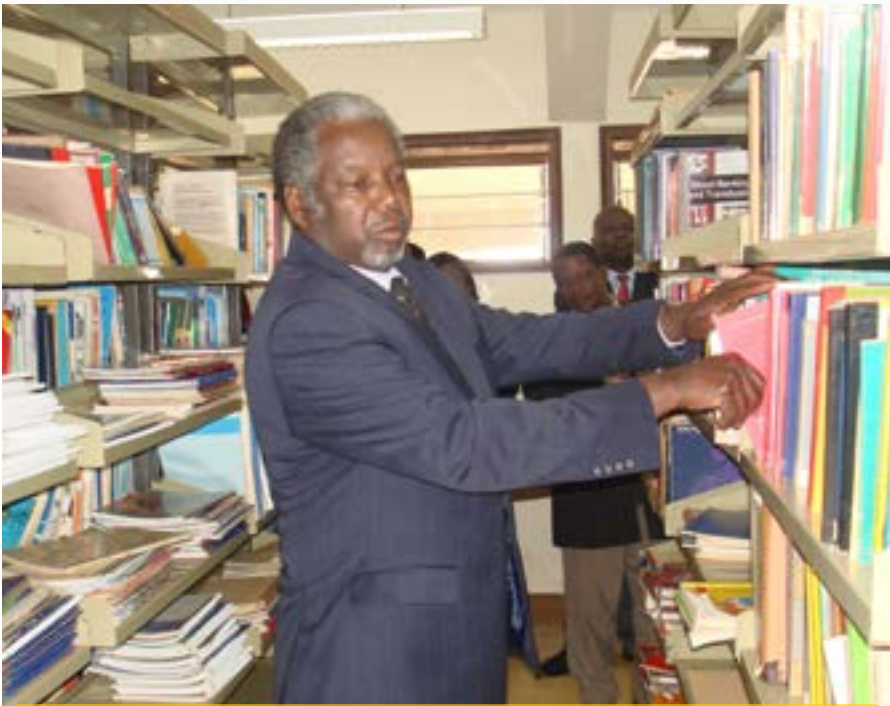

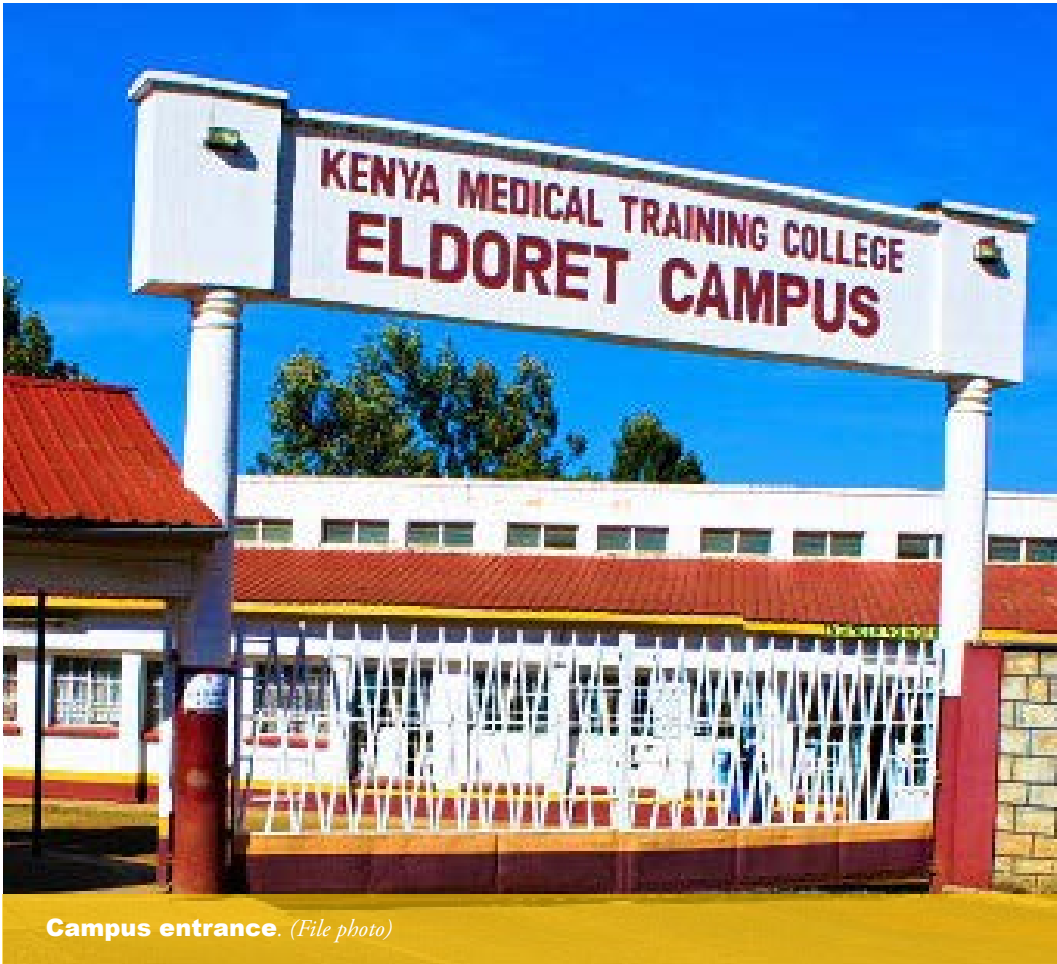

# 2000: LODWAR CAMPUS

The objective was to produce local personnel to give better Health services to both sedentary and nomadic pastoral communities, Hospitals, Health Centers, Dispensaries, and Health Posts. This includes outreach and mobile Health Care services for pastoral nomadic communities and settled communities without Health facilities.

The Norwegian Government started laying the foundation for construction on 20<sup>th</sup> May 1988. The Government of Kenya took over in 1989.

This enabled the Campus to admit the first class of Nutrition and Dietetics.

In 2010, the Ministry for Development of Northern Kenya and other Arid Lands supplied the Campus with 44 desktop computers and four laptops to enhance Students learning through internet connectivity. They also constructed two hostels to accommodate 82 Students and constructed three (3) classrooms to accommodate one hundred and fifty (150) Students. The Ministry also gave 3 million shillings for the renovation of structures.

In 2016, the Turkana County Government, under the leadership of Governor Josephat Nanok, seconded eight (8) Nursing Lecturers and one (1) Nutrition Lecturer to the Campus to ease the acute shortage of lecturers in the College. The County Government of Turkana also constructed three (3) classrooms and one hostel to accommodate 200 Students.

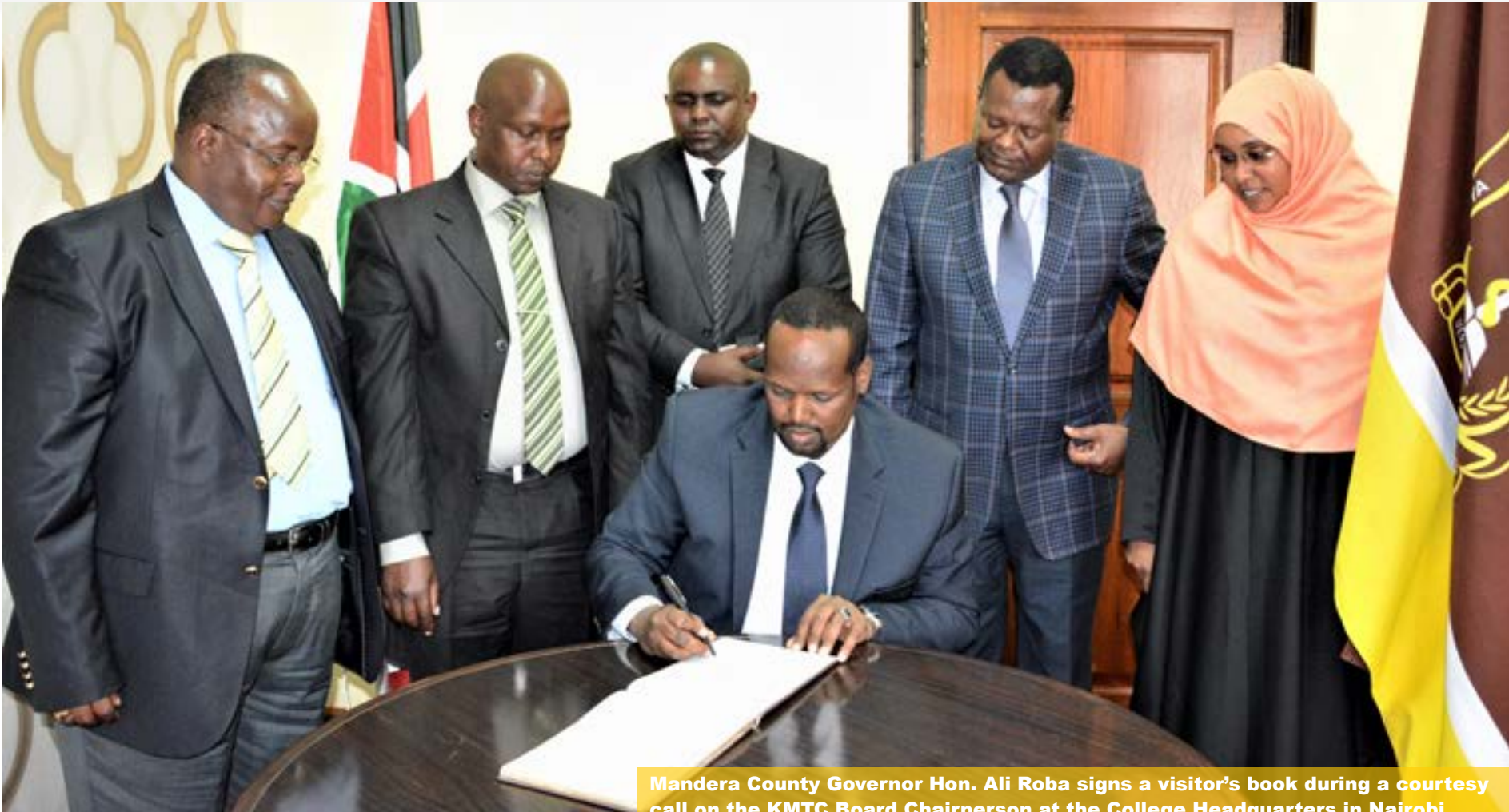
