<p>CYBER SECURITY AWARENESS</p> <p>Is this course for you?</p>	<p>This course is intended to provide awareness about the importance of cybersecurity and the tools and resources needed to stay safe online, also provide ways to increase resiliency in the event of a cyber incident. The programme has fifteen modules which have been developed by our highly regarded technical team. Each module varies in length between 30 minutes to 90 minutes - but each can be tailored to suit individual or institutional needs. The flow of our online course uses asynchronous (not live/own time) learning activities. This course will have regular text discussions via the course discussion forums, as well as readings and course materials.</p>

Discuss social networking and physical security. Discuss ways of staying safe online and Protecting your personal computer Explain the techniques and barriers to Data Security & Data Destruction Explain risk factors and Mobile Device Security
<p>Course Study Skills</p>	<p>As an adult learner your approach to learning will be different to that from your school days: you will choose what you want to study, you will have professional and/or personal motivation for doing so and you will most likely be fitting your study activities around other professional or domestic responsibilities.</p> <p>Essentially you will be taking control of your learning environment. Therefore, you will need to consider performance issues related to time management, goal setting, stress</p>

	<p>management, etc. Perhaps you will also need to reacquaint yourself in areas such as essay planning, coping with assignments and using the web as a learning resource.</p> <p>Your most significant considerations will be time and space i.e. the time you dedicate to your learning and the environment in which you engage in that learning.</p> <p>We recommend that you take time now--before starting your self-study--to familiarize yourself with these issues.
